• **Local Business: Octapharma Plasma**

Octapharma is a plasma donation center located at 15828 SE McLoughlin Blvd. in Oak Grove where you donate plasma, not blood. You can make up to \$700 per month. Plasma goes on to help auto immune deficiency disorders, hemophiliacs and others. Plasma from people with COVID has saved lives. There are requirements for who can donate and how often. The center must comply to FDA rules and European FDA standards as well. Homeless people cannot donate because they are high risk

and do not have an address. There are certain medications that prevent you from being able to donate; if you were in Europe during Mad Cow, you cannot donate. Of the people who come in, 98% can donate. They do not drug test – drugs do not enter plasma. Most people successfully make it through the process and donate. Unlike blood donations, you can donate plasma multiple times a week because it replenishes quickly.

They are still meeting by Zoom. Members have been helping out at vaccine centers. They have some new equipment, including radios, which can be distributed. They are hoping to meet in person again soon.
