Did you know? Fewer than one third of Oregon veterans claim U.S. Veterans Administration health, financial and other benefits for which they qualify. This suggests that at least 17,000 veterans in Clackamas County have less – or at best, more expensive – education, health care, and other services than they deserve. Many veterans got the runaround from the VA when they came home, but times have changed, and so has the VA. A “no” yesterday could be a “yes” today. LINCC has scheduled a system upgrade to occur June 6-8, 2022. During the upgrade, staff and patrons will be able to check items out, renew items, search the catalog, place holds, and make payments. Staff can also register new patrons, although changes to existing accounts will not be possible. We appreciate your patience during this important update.
