Jerry Herrmann is founder and president of Rivers of Life Center, a Northwest nonprofit training and education organization for at-risk youth and young adults. Jerry is rightfully very proud to have been the winner of the Sixth Annual Oregon Stewardship Award from the University of Oregon Museum of Natural and Cultural History. The project Jerry spearheaded through the Rivers of Life Center is “Youth Rebuild Mt Scott Watersheds”. Through the project, more than 200 youth restored more than five miles of creeks and streams of Mt Scott in Clackamas County. They built habitats for beaver, muskrat, otter, and native birds, as well as a network of trails and interpretive exhibits. Administered by the museum’s advisory council, the award recognizes a project that has significantly involved its community in an environmental or cultural heritage project – one that aligns with the museum’s mission to inspire stewardship of our collective past, present and future. Two courses are open for registration, namely First Aid and CPR/AED. These are important skills to have for emergency and non-emergency situations. As we all learned during the pandemic, in a disaster, medical facilities and staff are quickly overwhelmed. Only the sickest patients and those with immediate life-threatening injuries receive treatment. Everyone else goes to the back of the line and waits. Thinking about our own Cascadia Subduction Zone earthquake, the situation will be the same. First responders and medical facilities will be completely overwhelmed. Roads may be impassable for days or even weeks. You will be ON YOUR OWN. Located on the former site of a Smucker's processing plant, the center was created to demonstrate what people could do to reclaim industrial sites, address stormwater issues and restore wildlife habitats in urban areas. Each year thousands of people visit to explore the 5-acre site and learn about watershed health. The site serves as an important stormwater facility for the college campus and provides critical wetland habitat for resident and migratory birds, such as the great blue heron, wood duck and merganser. 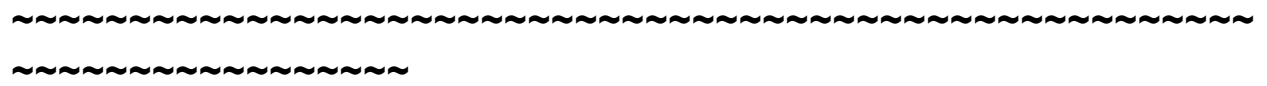
